# Cell Block 7 Jazz Band

Sonoma Valley Moose Lodge, 20580 Broadway Ave., Sonoma The leader of the Cell Block 7 Jazz Band, Bob Romans, was a retired band/music teacher in Lodi, CA, who was a classically-trained musician, accomplished in all styles. He was always interested in Dixieland Jazz, but didn't actually start doing it until 1981, with the formation of "The Cell Block 7 Jazz Band". His love for jazz has really blossomed through working with this band and continues undiminished. He named his band after another band in Texas, without realizing it, but then he became friends with the cornet player from the other band, Tommy Loy, who played with this Cell Block 7 Jazz Band at the Edinburgh Jazz Festival in 2002 and they became good friends. Bob Romans then felt comfortable to continue using "The Cell Block 7 Jazz Band" as the name of this band.

There have many changes through the years, but The Cell Block 7 Jazz Band favors the West Coast traditional jazz sounds of Lu Watters, Turk Murphy and the Bay City Jazz Band of the '50's, in a classic jazz lineup, led by two cornets. Their many festivals, tours, and concert successes are a direct result of their very professional approach coupled with a great sound and an extensive repertoire.

The Cell Block 7 Jazz Band is a very versatile and entertaining band. By doubling their talents on the double bell euphoniums, Cell Block 7 is able to produce some very different sounds – from fast, exciting trios to smooth and mellow blues – all in great low brass harmony.

Bob Sakoi, trumpet, double bell euph.

<u>Bob Embry</u>, clarinet, soprano sax, vocals, arranger, announcer. Retired public school music teacher.

<u>Dan Talbert</u>, trombone, double bell euph, vocals. Many years with CB7. Retired High School Band Director.

Daryl Hosick, piano. Many years with CB7. Retired Satellite Engineer.

<u>Tom Downs</u>, tuba, with CB7 many years. Retired from Lawrence Berkeley Laboratory.

Bob Stover, drums, with CB7 three years. Retired public school music teacher.

<u>Bill Dendle</u>, Banjo. Playing with CB 7 for about six months! World renowned banjoist!! Head of the Sacramento Jazz Camp every summer.

#### Changes at the Sonoma Moose Lodge, for Saturday, April 8, 2023

The parking lot for the Sonoma Moose Lodge is behind the building. When you see the sign for "Sonoma Moose Lodge", then you take the driveway to the right to get behind this building, which is where you park your car. If you walk in the door in the middle of the building, in the back, that is the most efficient way to get to the music/dancing room. You'll come into the bar then take the door in front of you, going into the rest of the building, where we have our admissions table. After arranging admission, you then take the door to your left, which leads into the big room, with the stage, for the featured band, chairs in front of the stage for the "jammers" (intermission musicians), a dance floor, a number of round tables situated through out the room for sitting &/or eating while the music is playing. If you're thirsty, you can decide to get a water/soda pop from the bar, an alcoholic drink with a "drink ticket" or a Moose member accompanying you to the bar (Moose rules). A group known as the "Women of the Moose" will be making sandwiches which you can choose to buy for some food during the show, if you're interested. Always feel free to ask questions of any the NVDJS members. Next is just enjoying the music!

What's Coming Next To Napa Valley Dixieland Jazz Society, After The Cell Block 7 Jazz Band on Saturday, April 8<sup>th</sup>? We're all excited about the change at our next session, at the Sonoma Moose Lodge, 20580 Broadway Avenue, Sonoma, which will include a number of jammer musicians, carefully selected in advance, playing their instruments during the two 20 to 25 minute intermissions for the Cell Block 7 Jazz Band, after this featured band has played two of their three 45-minute sets.

We're also firmly ending the session at 4:00 pm, because we've found that so much of the audience leaves close to 4:00 pm, leaving the featured band playing their great music to smaller audiences. Our changes are intended to increase the time for quality music, qualified musicians and the density of the audience listening to these bands. Experimenting with some changes....
