# THE BICFOR jeff Hamilton bill Reinhart robert Young marty Eggers

<u>Jeff Hamilton</u> started drum lessons at age nine and classical piano studies at eleven. A move to New Orleans in 1974 offered him the opportunity to study, learn, and work with many of the wonderful older New Orleans musicians. Following tours in Europe and work in California, the late 80's and 90's found Jeff living in New Orleans again. Jeff was in constant demand working a daily trio gig on <u>Steamboat Natchez</u>, and as a regular drummer at <u>Preservation Hall</u>, with <u>Banu Gibson and her New Orleans Hot Jazz</u> throughout the country and abroad. Jeff's extensive travels have included piano gigs in Japan, Singapore, India and Europe.

Bill Reinhart's musical career began in the late 1960's playing piano with his own New Orleans-style jazz band. In the early 70's Bill moved from piano to tuba and launched a very successful Port City Jazz Band. The band played for state & county fairs throughout the western United States for over 45 years, along with jazz festivals and many corporate events throughout California, as well as multiple times to Europe. During that time, Bill changed instruments to string bass. In 1979 Bill Reinhart joined a handful of professional musicians to found the San Joaquin Dixieland Jazz Society in Stockton, California - still active and healthy today. Next Bill focused on being a side-man, now playing banjo and guitar in various bands - Clint Baker's New Orleans Jazz Band, Golden Gate Swing, the Cafe Borrone Allstars, Hal Smith's New Orleans Night Owls, the El Dorado Jazz Band, and the Grand Dominion Jazz Band. Most recently, Bill returned to tuba once again and plays regularly with Bob Schulz's Barbary Coast Jazz Band.

Robert Young is a multi-instrumentalist currently playing cornet and saxes with The Big Four, Clint Baker's Cafe' Borrone All Stars, the Big Four, and the Jessica King Quartet. He is very happy to play the bass saxophone with Scott Anthony's Golden Gate Rhythm Machine and also plays with Tom Barnebey's Hot Four. While living in Southern California, he took over the alto-bass position in the Golden Eagle Jazz Band, when Paul Woltz left to go to Washington. It was a thrill to play and record with them and their wonderful singer, the late Chris Norris. His career for 30 years was as a classical pianist and organist. He owns a classical Studebaker truck and lives with his wife, Jeanette, in Petaluma, CA.

<u>Marty Eggers</u>, who plays piano, bass and tuba, began his music career in Sacramento, CA, where as a teenager he helped found the <u>Sacramento Ragtime Society</u> in 1982. He has been playing music full-time since the early 90's, with a number of different musicians. He always adds so much to any musical group which he accompanies, as well as when he is playing solo. Marty is married to pianist and drummer, Virginia Tichenor. They live in Oakland, CA.

Ken Brock contacted us to say that Ken Keeler has stepped down as leader of the Devil Mountain and doesn't want to play anymore. As the new leader, Ken Brock has set up the Devil Mountain Jazz Band again and they will be playing at the San Joaquin Dixieland Jazz Society on May 7, 2023, and at Trad Jass, on November 5, 2023. As you can see, this is many of the same musicians who have been a part of this band for many years.
